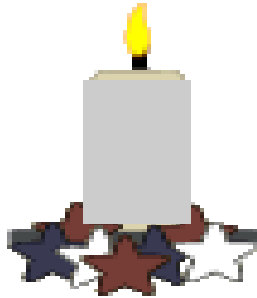

Dear people of God,
