Rector's Message

Dear People of God,

Today we celebrate the last Sunday after Epiphany, which focuses our attention on the Transfiguration. In the account of this event from the gospel of Matthew chapter 11:1-9, we have different themes and symbols taken from Israel's past and which center on her hopes for the future. Moses and Elijah represent the law and the Prophets; the teaching of the Law and the consummation and redemption of the prophecies find their fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

The Season of the Epiphany directs us to see the radiance of God's glory; the light of God's Holiness, revealed in the person of Jesus Christ. "For the God who said, "Out of darkness light shall shine," has caused his light to shine in our hearts, the light which is knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (11 Corinthians 4: 6) In the event of the Transfiguration is the discloser of God's intention for His people and the person, Jesus who reveals the New Law and fulfills the Old Law, thereby uniting both Old and New Testament. As Jesus taught the people and his disciples the Beatitudes of Matthew chapters 5, 6, and 7, and reinterprets the Holiness Code of Leviticus, (Lev. 18:26) through His commentary and application, He fulfills the Law and the Beatitudes in His life and the voluntary offering of Himself as a sacrifice on the cross. Saint Origen, Church Father stated, "All the beatitudes that Jesus uttered in the Gospel, he confirms by his example, exemplifying what he taught. So he says. 'Blessed are the meek' and again of himself, 'Learn from me, for I am meek.' He says, 'Blessed are the peacemakers,' and who is such a peacemaker as my Lord Jesus, who is our peace, who did away with the enmity and destroyed it in his flesh? 'Blessed are those who suffer persecution for righteousness sake' noone so endured persecution for righteousness' sake as the Lord Jesus, who was crucified for our sins. So the Lord displayed all the beatitudes in himself. Thus having said 'Blessed are they that weep,' he himself wept over Jerusalem, to lay the foundation of the beatitude also"

We are called, as the Baptised, to **follow Jesus** who calls us to "Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mat 5:48, Lk.6: 36) To be perfect describes God's wholeness or holiness, which is; *love, kindness, compassion, justice forgiveness, and reconciliation*. We are to demonstrate these attributes of God in all aspects of our lives so that the love, light and life of God can be seen in us and through us and among us.
