#### The Rector's Easter Message 2014

The disciples and the women accompanied Jesus for three years, as they listened to His teaching through the use of parables about the kingdom of God. He demonstrated its presence through the healing of the sick, the affirmation of divine love in the lives of the social outcast and the marginalized, exorcism and the raising of the dead. In spite of all the tangible expression, that Jesus was the embodiment of God's transforming presence among sinners, who had come to initiate a New Era, the disciples did not understand. They did not understand the sacrifice that had to be made and its benefits, that the path to kingdom, is the way of sacrificial love not force or violence.

Jesus revealed through the offering of Himself, the means used by God to accomplish His will among humanity and the world. The means of redemptive suffering is through the cross. Thus our lives and creation are the focus of God's redeeming love and assurance of His presence as we face the challenging issues of life. In other words, the God who raised Jesus from the dead is not interested in our crucifixion, rather God is focussed on our being raised to New Life with a Christ-Centered sense of purpose. The resurrection of Jesus is an unequivocal expression of God's vindication of His life of faith and trust in the purposes of God. Also it is a statement of God's willingness to reconcile us to Himself, through divine forgiveness. Thus sin is defeated and all barriers that had alienated us from God have been removed and fellowship is now available to all who believe in the Lord. This is God's work and initiative and the motive and purpose is the love of God for us

A significant message of the resurrection according to the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles is the change in the disciples, when they found themselves face-to-face with the risen Christ. Actually seeing Him alive changed them from disbelief to become witness of the resurrected Lord. They had seen the Lord with the nail prints on His hands and feet and found courage to believe. Since it happened to the first disciples, it can happen to us. Christ is Risen! We are entrusted with this mission to proclaim Christ who was raised by the power of God's love.

On behalf of the Church Committee and the Church Family I extend to all members and visitors a Holy and Blessed Easter.
