Looking at the circumstances was the cause of Peter's failure. Therefore as a people of faith, we should never waver mentally as to the outcome. The disciples started out on the journey in the boat afraid. Some were afraid to return to Herod's country during the expected commotion over John's death, or were unwilling to embark without Him.

Jesus needed to spend some time alone with God. Alone with God in retirement from the world and alone in prayer and meditation. Jesus did what was necessary to keep Him focused mentally so he would not waver in conducting His earthly ministry.

The Jews divided the night into three parts of four hours. So between 3 - 6 a.m. Jesus walked on the water to be with them. They thought He was an apparition; because an apparition by night had always been a superstition among all nations. To sailors it has always been a sign of shipwreck. So they cried out of fear for their lives.

We are faced with many problems at once or simultaneously in our lives, and we wonder how we are going to make it through. We cannot hide, we cannot run away but we have to face those turbulent circumstances. How do we overcome? We overcome by keeping our minds in Christ. Once we rise everyday looking on the circumstances we are defeated. But by looking to Jesus we will never sink. Peter reached out to Jesus in faith. And Jesus answered his request. Peter was able to walk on water because he believed in Jesus but the wind distracted him and his focus changed. His mind was now on what the wind might do to him and not on what Jesus was doing for him. Jesus answered his request to bid him to come to Him. We make our requests of Jesus, but when we do we must never waver mentally as Jesus work things out for us.

If we want a prayer to be answered we must never: hesitate, doubt, and be at variance with ourselves, we must not stagger over the greatness of the promise, we must never say yes or no in our determination, but trusting in God's power, and we must never waiver mentally as to the outcome.
