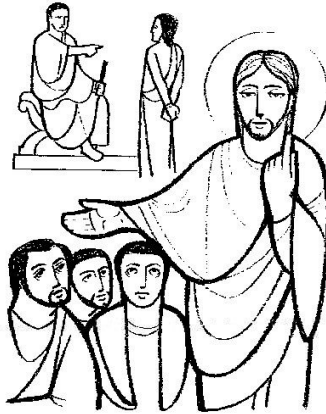

Having The Right Attitude As Christians

Phillipians 2:3-4

In the ancient world humility was never considered to be a virtue. It only came around to be regarded as such when Jesus began teaching about humility. As a result of His new teaching and ‘strange’ way of acting many were offended; but those who he reached out to, were transformed by love.

The desire to boast and exaggerate our importance is still deeply rooted in human nature. This excessive concern with ourselves also leads us to believe we are better Christians than others. So Paul here reminds us to consider others better than ourselves (2:3). We are to look for and emulate the good traits in our Christian brothers and sisters. In so doing we will avoid falling into pride and boasting.

Pride and boasting creates the perfect environment for many negatives to grow. These lead to disunity that destroys Christian communities. These include: selfish ambition, vanity, a lack of humility, looking down on others, and focusing on one’s own interests. Those who follow Christ should have concern for the community as well as for themselves. True Christians should have a ‘body’ mindset. The body mindset is one in which we realize we are part of a WHOLE, and all of us are important in helping things to operate effectively. In Africa there is the saying, ‘I am because we are’. With the right mindset as a church and as a people there is much more that we can accomplish.
