The St. Andrew Parish Church Home For Girls

The St. Andrew Parish Church has been a prominent landmark in the parish of St. Andrew for over 350yrs. The Church has been actively involved with education and missions within the parish, and has several outreach projects in which it demonstrates its commitment to the society and to the welfare of those groups in the community, which are in greatest need of assistance.

One such project is St. Andrew Parish Church Home for Girls which is located at 16 Ellesmere Road Kingston 10. It had its genesis in 1969 as a hostel for young girls. It was a joint effort of St. Andrew Parish Church and the Rotary Club of Kingston. In August 1974 it was felt that the hostel could serve a more meaningful purpose in the society, so The Home for Girls' became a reality with the first set of girls being sent there by the Juvenile Court. All girls came to the home through the Ministry of Youth, and were admitted to the home because they are either abandoned by their families, or families were not in a position to give them the care and protection they deserve.

The Home has a capacity for 21 girls, aged 9 to 18. The primary aim of the home is to foster the spiritual, physical, educational, emotional and social development of each girl. They are cared for in an atmosphere of Christian love and are required to attend Sunday Service and/or Sunday School. They are encouraged to get involved in the Church's activities.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors worshipping with us today.

Did You Know?

There are oils used by the church for different anointing. These oils are blessed at a special celebration, the Chrism Mass, presided over by the bishop in the diocesan cathedral on the morning of Maundy Thursday.

There is the oil of the catechumens (OC) for the newly baptized who are anointed with the sign of the cross. This indicates that they are incorporated into Christ and share in the royal and prophetic priestly ministry of Christ. The anointing at Confirmation with the oil of Sacred Chrism (SC) showed that the baptized are sealed with the Holy Spirit. And the anointing with the oil of the infirm (OI) is a means of healing for body, mind and soul; (James 5:14). In these Sacraments the meaning of oil as a sign of healing and salvation is expressed by the Church through its Ministry.
