Rector's Message

In the gospels, the miracles of Jesus authenticated His message, "...If it is by the finger of God that I cast out the demons, then the Kingdom of God has come to you." (Luke 11:20) The miracles performed by Jesus were not just a demonstration of God's work in power; rather they identified Jesus as the Messiah, the Anointed Son of God. Through His actions of Teaching, Healing, and Exorcism, Jesus identified the central need of human persons; the healing of the centre of thought, ambition, will and choice. This is the place of our attitude, behaviour, motive and intention, which determines our relationship to God, other persons and self, the heart.

Thus the mission of Jesus was the healing and restoration of our human nature from alienation to harmony, from sin and death to wholeness and peace. In the actions and message of Jesus, we see what God does, and what God is constantly doing among us. The transformation of the source of the disease is the heart of human choice, our human nature. Healing takes place because Jesus became what we are in order that we might become what He is. Thus healing is not only a restoration of prior physical health. It is also a reorientation of our hearts to God's purposes for our lives.

Although Jesus in many situations would heal a person of their physical sickness, He would also exhort them to go and sin no more (John 8:11). The healing of the individual's physical state, was a precursor to the act of spiritual healing, in which Jesus forgives the individual of his sins, and sets him free to be made whole to experience God's loving-mercy, forgiveness, joy and peace. Some of us need to be healed physically, many emotionally and others psychologically, however, we all need to be healed spiritually, because we are all addicted to sin; we are all sinners. In the forgiveness of the Lord, we experience healing of the heart of our souls, for growth to produce the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22). The Baptised disciple of Jesus, who is in a personal and active relationship with the Lord, is required to grow in faith and strive for wholeness.

One of the consequences of ill health is alienation, which has been bridged by the crucified and risen Jesus Christ. As sinners saved by grace, and forgiven by the Lord, we are called to live a life of gratitude, faith, joy and peace. In our journey of faith, we give thanks for what the Lord continues to do for us each day, and thereby find joy for these blessings received and experience peace, knowing that God is working His purpose out according to His love, mercy and grace.
