We celebrated the feast of the Epiphany on January 6th, which marks the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles. The link between Christmas Day, the Epiphany and the Baptism of our Lord is the church's emphasis on identifying who it is that was born in Bethlehem of Judea. Epiphany speaks to us of the divine presence; "The true light that enlightens every person..." (John 1:9) is made known to the world through the person and life of Jesus Christ.

The Pascal mystery is also celebrated at this time, as the message of Christmas and Epiphany exalt the Lord who emptied Himself of equality with God, lived a human life, humbled Himself in obedience to the Father's will (even to suffering and death on the cross) and was raised as Lord and Saviour. The revelation of Jesus Christ as the light of the world is God's expression of His unconditional love for us. "***Nothing is so strong, so irresistible as divine love. It brought forth all the creation; it enkindles all the life of heaven; it is the song of all the angels of God. It has redeemed the world; it seeks for every sinner upon the earth; it embraces all the enemies of God and from the beginning to the end of time, the work of providence is the one work of love.***" (The Spirit of Prayer, William Law)

These events of Jesus' baptism, and His turning water into wine at the wedding at Cana of Galilee, are "epiphanies" which cast new light upon Jesus' mission. The primary message of the epiphany is that seeking Jesus is the beginning of the journey of faith. It's not an end in itself. Our encounter with Jesus as the light, enables us to dispel the darkness of our ego-centric lives, in order for us to shine as Christ's light of peace, love, joy, forgiveness, reconciliation and hope in the world.

In the renewal of our baptismal vows and promises, last Sunday, we recommitted ourselves to pursue the mission of God that Jesus lived. In this act, Jesus identifies with the spiritual needs of humanity and is empowered by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit's descent on Jesus "like a dove" remained with Jesus throughout His ministry. As members of Christ family, through Baptism, the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit anoints us ***to live the life*** of faith, through the values of the Kingdom, for the purpose of our transformation and the world.

Baptism is not merely a ceremony, it is the action of the ***community of the baptized*** that initiates a person into the faith of the One who lived and died for our salvation. We are called as the ***beloved*** of God to ***listen*** to Him, ***submit*** to Him and ***follow*** Him, day by day. This is our ***commitment*** and sacred trust as the Baptized people of God.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors worshipping with us today.
