The Rector is on leave for the month of August.

When parents demonstrate absolute love for their children, especially when they prove to be disrespectful, feelings of dismay and frustration are usually experienced. According to the Psalmist in Psalm 81:1, 10-16, this was the sentiment expressed by God, based on the actions of the Israelites - God's chosen people.

In this passage, we see a lament from God, in which God questioned the unfaithfulness of the Children of Israel, as, in spite of God's goodness and bountiful provision for them, they refused to hear the voice of God and do what God has commanded. They were engaged in idolatrous practices and constantly committed evil deeds towards their neighbours. Consequently, their failure to obey God resulted in their own demise as a nation, because their relentless behaviour contributed to a decline in morals, values and other social norms in the society. Due to their stubbornness of heart, it is no wonder therefore that verse 12 tells us that God allowed them to "... follow their own devices". Therefore, a failure to listen to, and obey the voice of God, allows evil to flourish

However, a conscious decision, to obey God's voice and do God's bidding yields a different result, and this is justified by Psalm 81:14-16, in which we see the benefits that the nation would receive if they would only listen to God and walk in God's ways. The psalmist states that God would subdue their enemies, defend them from their foes and both provide for and satisfy their needs. Obedience to God's law therefore results in an orderly society, with amazing rewards including peace among all people, a state where the hungry are fed, the neglected feel loved, and the needs of the poor are met. These are outcomes of being obedient to God's commands. These rewards/qualities speak to the type of life that God requires of us, as they demonstrate how much we love both God and our neighbours (Luke 10:27).

As we look forward to the new school term, let us be mindful that if we really want to shape the behaviours and attitudes of our children, we must teach them to understand what it means to love and to be obedient to the voice of God. If they are able to do this, they will be able to discern and demonstrate how to show love and respect towards their classmates, teachers, siblings, and parents. This, my brothers and sisters, is important because our children need to realize that when they show love and respect to others, it pleases God. Such lifestyles, should therefore be encouraged, as they allow each person to feel valued, loved and appreciated as individuals who are made in God's image and likeness.
