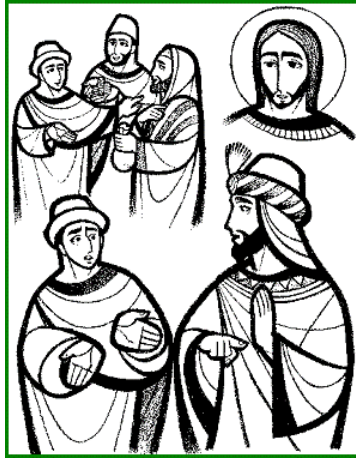

Did you know?

There is a difference between a Tabernacle and an Aumbry. Though both are used for the exclusive reservation of the consecrated elements (the Body and Blood of Christ), the Tabernacle is either placed on an Altar or an adjacent wall to the Altar, while an Aumbry is less obvious, because it is set into the wall. However, both are able to be locked in order to prevent the consecrated elements from being removed without authorization.

Quote for reflection

“The five Marks stress the doing of mission. Faithful action is the measure of our response to Christ (cf Matt. 25:31 - 46; Jas. 2:14 - 26) However, the challenge facing us is **not just to do mission**, but to **be a people of mission**. That is, we are learning to allow every dimension of church life to be shaped and directed by our identity as a sign, foretaste and instrument of God’s reign in Christ.
