The gospel for Christmas Day from Luke 2:1-14 tells of the gift of the birth of the Christ-Child to simple parents, who were oppressed and subjected to the manipulations of the Roman colonial authorities. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. But it also speaks of the announcement of the birth to the shepherds, who were among the most marginalized of their day, announcing the fulfillment of their hope and the good news for humanity. That this birth to simple peasant parents takes place in a stable and is announced to shepherds in the field, locates it among the simple folks who are neglected by the power structures of their day and who receive little or no attention from the powers that be. The child who is the source of good news for the people, grows into adulthood and demonstrates a love and compassion for children.

Our World Today is one which is struggling to find signs of hope. It is true in relation to the outcome of the Presidential Elections in the United Sates, Brexit in Britain, the endless wars in Syria and other places, and the uncertainty of a global economy which no one can predict where it is leading. No one who has access to a television these days can claim ignorance regarding the suffering of large numbers of our children across the world, whether in Syria, or in those fresh memories of the faces of those children trying to cross into Europe as they fled the violence and poverty of their homeland.

In Jamaica we are aware of the abuse and neglect of countless numbers of our children, and an increasing targeting of children and infants in the violence and murder being committed by criminal elements. So let us step back from the trivializing of central elements of our faith tradition by secular and commercial interests, and the attempt to be politically correct, by taking out the content of our celebration of Christmas, and by passing it off as just another holiday, and instead, affirm the joy which Christmas brings to the life of humanity. Let us also grasp the imperative which the venerable Saint Nicholas 4<sup>th</sup> century Bishop of Myra, and the Christ-Child highlight to bring joy to humanity seeking for hope in a seemingly hopeless world and in making a difference to the life of our vulnerable children in our society and across the world.

## **Faith Formation and Christian Education**

## Did you know?

December 25 was celebrated as the birth date of Jesus by the early 4th century AD, and probably much earlier. It is believed that this date was selected because the Romans celebrated the Mithraic festival of the sung god on that day. This date was therefore seen by the church as an opportunity to make a pagan festival into a religious one.
