## Faith Formation and Christian Education

### Did you know?

The Compass Rose is a symbol of Anglican Communion, which was designed by the late Canon Edward West of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York. The centre of the Compass Rose contains the cross of St. George (which reminds us of the English Heritage of the Anglican Church), and is surrounded by the inscription in Greek "The truth shall set you free." There is also a bishop's mitre atop the northern arrow of the compass, which emphasizes the centrality of the episcopate and apostolic order in the Anglican Communion. The points of the compass reflect the spread of Anglican Christianity throughout the world. (*The Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society*, 2017)

"It would have been amazing enough if Jesus had said, "I always turn the other cheek when someone wrongs me," or "I refuse to return violence when violence is done to me."
