Background

The St. Andrew Settlement (SAS) was founded in 1965 by the Anglican Diocese in Jamaica as an outreach project of the St. Andrew Parish Church. The main objective of SAS is to aid in the development of the community of Majesty Gardens through spiritual and social activities, education and medical care so they can build a healthy and productive community.

Majesty Gardens is located off the Spanish Town Road, west of the Hagley Park Road round-about, nestled between the D.C. Tavares Market and the Agricultural Marketing Corporation (AMC) and houses over 3,000 residents, 1,000 of whom are children. The SAS also serves the adjoining communities of Hunts Bay and Payne Avenue. In 2005 SAS received the Gleaner Company 'Man of the Year Award' for its work and contribution to the development of Majesty Gardens.

Funding

The St. Andrew Settlement (SAS) is primarily funded through various donations from the private sector and other non-governmental local and international organizations. We also receive some funding from St. Andrew Parish Church, as well as the Government of Jamaica in the form of medical drugs for the Health Centre. However, we depend on other sources of funding for the majority of our day-to-day operational expenses. These sources of funding have come from voluntary contributions, local and overseas donations, and various fund raising activities. It is through these donations in cash and kind that we are able to continue to provide the services we offer to the community.

VISION

To transform the Majesty Gardens community to a self sufficient, educated and peaceful community

Managing Board

The governance structure of The Settlement provides for management oversight by a Managing Board which includes volunteers from the St. Andrew Parish Church, The Rector and a representative from the community. They meet on a monthly basis to review policy and the finances of SAS and set the annual strategic objectives and programmes for SAS.

Administration and Staffing

The St. Andrew Settlement's day to day operational activities is managed by an Executive Director, who along with a Social Worker, Nurse and 14 other full-time staff members provide services for the community.

OUR WORK

The St. Andrew Settlement (SAS) offers a wide variety of services which give direct benefit to the residents of Majesty Gardens. The key objective of our programmes is to educate, challenge and plant seeds of transformation in the hearts and minds of members of the community. These services and programmes are broken down into four (4) categories: Education, Health Care, Positive Living and Spiritual.

Spiritual

Sunday Service:

Weekly church services are held in the St. Thomas Mission House for members of the community. This provides an avenue for us to minister to persons in the community while building their own spiritual commitment.

Sunday School:

Every Sunday during service Sunday School is held and directed by volunteers from St. Andrew Parish Church. Children attend and learn the various moral and spiritual lessons of the bible in a fun learning environment.

Counselling:

This provides an avenue for persons to share their various emotional and spiritual challenges, and receive guidance on how to overcome them.

Bible Study:

Every Monday evening bible study classes are held for members of the community.

Education

The Majesty Gardens Infant School:

It was established in 2015 and is an offshoot of the former basic school that was founded in 1954. The school, which falls under the Ministry of Education, caters to children between the ages of four and six years. The school is managed by a Board, and the Principal along with 4 full-time teachers

Learning Centre:

The pre-school provides an important foundation for life-long learning by catering to the educational needs of 2 1/2 to 4 year olds and is the main feeder school to the Infant School. The school's early childhood programme is approved by the Early Childhood Commission.

Home Work Programme:

Through our partners we also offer a mentoring and home work programme.

Health Services

An active community health programme is one of the major services offered to members of the community. On a monthly basis approximately 320 residents are seen by the doctors and dentists.

Medical Care:

Four medical doctors freely volunteer their time and service to the community using our Health Centre. Basic medication is also provided to patients as directed by the doctors and fulfilled by a part-time pharmacist.

Dental Services:

Two dentists offer their services free of cost to provide dental services to the members of the community and its environs.

Positive Living

Day Care for the Elderly:

As part of our ministry, we provide day care services for the elderly in the community through the provision of daily meals and medical support.

Youth Club:


This initiative provides a good medium for positively impacting the lives of young people. They are involved in various youth activities hosted at the community centre, and participate in our annual Christian summer camp.

Jamaica Library Service:

A branch of the Kingston & St. Andrew Parish Library Service is also located within the community centre and they provide computer services and access to a variety of reading materials for the community members.
