The first Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of the Church's year. Advent directs our attention to the "last things" (eschatology), that is, the Second Coming of Christ and the consummation of God's purposes in creation and the lives of human persons.

Salvation is central to eschatology (last things) and is the foundation on which the church proclaims God's action in the past, His activity in the present and His Sovereignty over the affairs of men and women in the future. Repentance is necessary for the forgiveness of sins and to obtain Salvation. This is the constant proclamation of the Church to disobedient sinners who need to acknowledge their disobedience to God's voice and unwillingness to act with compassion, to speak in love and to walk with humility.

Andrew was a missionary disciple who having met the Messiah went to share the Good News with his brother. "One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus" (John 1:40-42a NRSV). This action of Andrew is a model of disciplining for us to pattern as we focus on our theme for this year. We have a duty to share the good news of our experience of Jesus Christ who died for our sins, and was raised by the power of God and now offers the forgiveness of sins and the liberating gift of the Holy Spirit to all who believe and repent. This is our commitment as disciples of Jesus.

Advent connects us in different ways to a fundamental element of the Christian life; the **in between time**. The **in between time** is that period between Christ's First Coming and His Second Coming at the end of the age. This is the time for us to witness to the Christ-event, which is all that God has done for us in and through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, and the importance for us to be **prepared** for we do not know the day or the hour.

The final Advent of the Lord may be nearer now with the passing of time, than it was at the time of Saint Andrew. This in between time requires us to live a life of holiness, and to share the faith and to be awake and ready for the unexpected coming of the Son of God. "Then two will be in the field; one will be taken and one will be left. Two women will be grinding meal together; one will be taken and one will be left. Keep awake therefore..." (Matthew 24:40-42a NSRV).

A warm welcome to all those who are visiting with us, especially the Venerable Patrick Cunningham, Archdeacon of our Region. Special greetings are also extended to the St. Andrew Scout Troop who are worshipping with us this morning.

Did You Know?

Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus*, meaning "coming" Advent begins the church year, starting four Sundays before Christmas. Advent is a time for self-examination and repentance, as the church continues to prepare for Christ's Second Coming; even as it prepares for Christmas. Advent wreaths have their origins in the folk traditions of northern Europe, where in the deep of winter people lit candles on wheel-shaped bundles of evergreen. Both the evergreen and the circular shape symbolized ongoing life. The candlelight gave comfort at this *darkest time of the year*, as people looked forward to the longer days of spring.

Quote for Reflection

The season of Advent encourages us to practice setting aside "quiet times" for reading, reflection and prayer. It is by practicing these disciplines that we grow in the knowledge and awareness of God and by extension, experience personal growth and a strengthening of our faith. We encourage this discipline for all Christians, for it is as important as eating our daily meals.
