Rector's message

Making Sound decisions is one of the most important skills that we can acquire in life. It demands being able to assess a situation and determine the best course of action. In this process we have to weigh the options, identify our emotions and explore the consequences of the choices that we make. Whatever method we may use to evaluate a situation, our ability to make decisions does not take place in a vacuum "In the end beyond techniques and criteria, discernment is a matter of character and sensitivity of becoming the person we should be." Herein, Jesus is a model for us to follow, as he constantly discerned the will of God the Father and decisively pursues his ministry "I have come to do the will of the one who sent me." John 4:34

It is the will of God for us to be guided by the life giving Spirit rather than our inner compulsion, instinct or by external prohibition. In this regard we are equipped as disciples of Jesus with the Holy Spirit to learn to discern God's will, by developing our spiritual intuition and become resilient in our faith. This spiritual intuition is a necessary part of our vocation to be a disciple of Jesus. It demands trust in God who enlightens and illuminates us at the most decisive moments of our lives. "It's not enough simply to believe God exists and that God is good. Deep in the soul, we have <u>experienced God's presence</u> and God's <u>personal</u> love for us." In other words, such intimacy with God through prayer enables us to accept with deep peace those difficult and unresolved issues of our lives and having the conviction that God is working his purpose out, even in the most challenging situations.

Lent is a time for us to deliberately reflect on the temperature of our spiritual health and ask the searching question: are we hot, cold or luke warm. If we do not intentionally assess our spiritual health, we are prone to vegetate or just drift along loosing vitality in the spiritual sinews of our soul. We must remember that we are fragile like dust and are always in need of rejuvenation through repentance, prayer and worship. Lent invites us to take a daily walk with Jesus as we practice the spiritual discipline of Prayer and meditation, solitude and abstinence, charity and charitable deeds. (Matthew 6:1-21). It is through a daily practice of these spiritual disciplines that Christian formation takes place, as we are moulded and shaped by the Holy Spirit to live Jesus shaped lives.

A Daily Devotional & Spiritual Discipline

A daily quiet time is a private meeting between a disciple and the Lord. It is a period of time set aside in advance for the single purpose of a personal meeting with the Triune God.

A daily quiet time consist of four (4) parts:

- 1. Lectio Divina: This is the reading of a passage of scripture. The intention is to meet the Lord through the written word. (Psalm 119:15, Acts 8:26-40)
- 2. **Meditating** (Reflecting) on the word. In this encounter we allow the word to saturate our minds, emotions and wills. (Psalm 1:2, 19:14)
- 3. **Prayer**, communion with God: Adoration and Praise (Ps 100, 150), Confession, Thanksgiving, and Intercession (Phil 4:6, Matt.6:6)
- 4. **Prayer of Supplication**: In simple words express to the Lord all your personal issues, concerns and how you are feeling. Then listen for the voice of the Lord.

This spiritual communion requires us to be constant as we use a variety of songs, hymns and a devotional book. Also, the use of Prayers from the Book of Common Prayer. (page 76-77,84). According to Mark 1:35 "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, and went off to a lonely place, where he prayed".

Prayer is a come-as-you-are affair. It is God's invitation as we are invited and welcomed into the sanctuary of His presence. As Richard Foster states in his book *Prayer: Finding your Hearts True Home* "The Lord is inviting you-and me-to come home, to come home to where we belong, to come home to that for which we were created. His arms are stretched out wide to receive us. His heart is enlarged to take us in. For too long we have been in the far country; a country of noise and hurry, and crowds, a country of climb and push and shove, a country of frustration and fear and intimidation. And He welcomes us home; home to serenity and peace and joy, home to friendship and fellowship and openness, home to intimacy and acceptance and affirmation." Prayer is a relationship with the One who has already declared that we are his beloved children and who desires to be close to us.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of the season of Lent - a period/time which the Christian Church uses for prayer, fasting, and spiritual preparation for Easter, in which we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. The season of Lent lasts for 40 days through to Holy Saturday, but does not include Sundays, since the Church sees each Sunday as *The Lord's Day* - The day of resurrection.
