Rector's message

Lent is a special time for the renewal of our life in Christ Jesus as we focus on our need for penitential pruning, and enlightenment, which are necessary not only for those preparing to be initiated through Baptism and Confirmation; Catechumens, but for all of us who intend to renew our commitment and vows of Baptism at Easter.

In our baptismal vows, renewed at Easter, we declared and promised to live our lives in the faith of Christ. A critical element that sustains us in the faith is our need to value this relationship and the practices that are necessary to sustain and enable our growth in the faith of Christ. A relationship that is taken for granted or abused or neglected will eventually wane, wither or loose its intensity and passion. Isn't it the same with our relationship with the Lord? Jesus said "I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me, you can do nothing." (John15:5) As trees send down their roots into the soil of the ground to be watered so that it gives them life, so our life in Christ requires us to send down our roots to the depths of the fount of God's love to be strengthened and sustained for our journey of faith.

With the presence of coronavirus (COVID-19) we are forced to change our social interaction. We are not to shake hands or touch each other and we are to wash hands frequently with soap and water or use alcoholbased sanitizer "when coughing or sneezing, cover your mouth and nose with your flexed elbow or with a tissue or wet-wipes; dispose of the tissue immediately and wash your hands." We are also to avoid close contact with each other when possible which includes hugging. These practices are necessary for everybody as we seek to reduce the possibility of an epidemic in our country. Also let us resist being overwhelmed and anxious and continue to pray for victims and their families and for an antiviral drug to be developed to help the healing process.

Did You Know?

The vestments and linens of the church during Lent, are characterized by a very dark purple to demonstrate the penitential nature of the season, with a focus on the need for corporate and personal spiritual renewal as a people. The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday and continues for forty days, excluding Sundays. (Sundays are excluded because they are celebration days - The Lord's Day of Resurrection; and since Lent is a penitential season, Sundays are therefore not included in the forty days counted for Lent.) The period of forty days draws its significance from the Jewish Passover and from Jesus' forty days of fasting and prayer in the wilderness.

In a second directive from the Archbishop of the West Indies – please note the following:

Refrain from handshaking during the Peace and the holding of hands during the Lord's Prayer.

While the Eucharistic Prayer includes both elements of bread and wine, when consecrated the cup should be consumed only by the President.

Holy Communion is to be administered in one kind only by the priest placing the host carefully in the communicant's hands. Intinction is not an option during this time of the epidemic. It is proposed that communicants receive the Host standing, rather than kneeling, as this would normally involve handling the rails which may be contaminated by others.
