Many cities and capitals of the world have been filled with people chanting “I can’t breathe”. These words represent the last words of a dying child of God, at the hands of another human being. Breathing is essential to life as air is necessary for living which is the first action of God towards Adam at creation. God breathed into his nostril and man became a living being (Gen 2:7). According to the book of Genesis, the gift of the breath of life by God is the work and action of the Holy Spirit of God. “We live and breathe in God’s atmosphere. So the Holy Spirit becomes new life’s vibrating and vitalizing field: we are in God and God in us” (The Source Of Life, Jürgen Moltman, Pg.55). This is the Spirit, who is the source of life and its vitality and the atmosphere in which we breathe and live.

As we enter the Season of Ordinary Time, which comes after Pentecost, the focus of the community of faith, the church, is centered on the life and ministry of Jesus in the Gospel readings and the work of the Holy Spirit within and through the church, in the New Testament readings. We also see the purposes of God unfolding in the Old Testament readings. It is necessary for us to recognize that according to the witness of scripture (the Bible), God’s action and presence is mediated to us and all living things of creation, through the Holy Spirit, who enables and sustains the will of God. “What God wills, God does.” God’s will is for us to breathe the breath of life and not for us to live on “life support”. Anything or anyone, or any system and structure that seeks to suffocate God’s breath in us, is not of God and is repulsive to God. It is God who constantly breathe into us through the atmosphere which sustains our lives. “I can’t breathe” has touched people of every race and religion as it speaks to the fundamental human right to life being violated and abused.

The response of the human family is repulsion and the assertion of the right to life in every circumstance and all situations. This is social equity which the prophets demanded of Israel’s leaders and the people, for the basic reason that, it is only God, who gives the breath of life. As we learn to live in the “new normal”, it is necessary for us the Baptized, to practice living Jesus shaped lives, for the purpose of facilitating the work of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who dwells in us, to breathe the NEW LIFE of *renewal* and *revival* in every aspect of daily living and for our wellbeing and our soul’s health.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors who are worshipping with us today and for those who are viewing online.
