The Rector is out of Office on Mondays

We now live in the “new normal” of keeping a distance from each other with our faces partially covered and hand shake forbidden. It is in these new restrictions, that we are to grow in the faith and practice our faith. Whatever may be our situation, the renewal of our faith must remain the source of inspiration, spiritual courage and purpose for living. Can we face our human problems and issues without faith in Jesus Christ? It is Jesus who lived a life of unswerving faith, despite facing a hostile environment of threats, criticism and often maligned, who would retreat at the end of an exhausting day to a quiet place for rest, solitude and awoke early to pray. “Come ye apart and rest awhile” (Mark 6:31b) From this daily practice, Jesus was renewed for ministry, to pursue his “call” and fulfil his mission.

In his daily interaction with the crowd, Jesus encountered people of different temperaments and every strata of the society, and persistently demonstrated that he would meet people at their point of need. Although he met their basic need for food, as he fed them, he indicated that bread alone was insufficient to meet their need, as they were also in need of food for the soul. In this way he helped them to see how much God the Father loved them, and this love made them precious and priceless in his sight. “Are not two sparrows sold for a penny?... you are of more value than many sparrows” (Matt 10:29-31) Jesus did not look past people or avoid their glance, rather he saw them and their need for more than food or material currency. In their tired faces, stressed out look and sad eyes was a yearning for God who alone can satisfy their souls’ desire. “Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.” (Matt.4:4)

Social intervention to provide things material for the marginalized, education, training and employment for unattached youths have not been able to solve the problem of the cycle of crime, turf war, scamming, extortion and the use of violence as a weapon to intimidate law abiding residents, especially those in densely populated communities. People have a need to be valued for their better selves despite unfulfilled lives, socio economic situations and their inadequacies. There are those persons who have been isolated, quarantined or sick in hospital because of Covid 19 and survived, who have a need to feel they belong and are still valued by family and the community. It is inhumane, dehumanizing and also repulsive to God, that there are families and communities all over the world, that reject those who once had the virus and now treat them as lepers and social rejects of their society. The good news is that Jesus welcomed all, especially those socially rejected and acknowledged them as a part of God’s family, citizens of God’s kingdom and members of the Church.
