The Rector is out of Office on Mondays

The arrival of the summer season with its heat and drought requires that we drink more water as often as we can. Rehydration is necessary for our kidneys and our overall health, as it constitutes over sixty (60) percent of our weight. It is also necessary for the functioning of our cells, organs and tissues and to regulate the body's temperature. Since the body breaks down all foods, except water, into sugar, which is stored and retrieved for energy, water facilitates the assimilation of minerals, amino acids, vitamins and flushes out waste and toxins. Water is mixed with wine in the Cup on the Altar and along with the host (bread), they are consecrated through the invocation of the Holy Spirit (Epiklesis), during the Eucharistic Prayer, as we focus on the Real Presence of Christ who is available to us in bodily form. With outstretched hands, we receive the Body of Christ which was broken for us, so that we are nourished and sustained to proclaim the Gospel of the rule and reign of the kingdom of God.

After Jesus was nailed to the cross, his side was pierced and blood and water flowed from his broken body (John 19:14). In this text from John 19:14, the writer and the Johannine Community are pointing us to recognize the work of Grace that comes through our Baptism in which we receive the Holy Spirit. The text, also refers to the Eucharist (Holy Communion) in which we partake of the Blood of Christ in order to have His life in us. Through the living water of Baptism, we are grafted into Christ, born again, (a process of transformation) and receive the new and eternal life, anointed to witness to the God who is faithful and who raised Jesus, for our participation in the mission of God.

The storage levels of water in the Hermitage and Mona reservoirs, have forced some of us to be conscious of the value of water. We often take it for granted, although after it is blessed, its presence within the church, at the Font beside the Pascal Candle, signifies that the Baptized are incorporated into the family of God and empowered by the Holy Spirit to live a life of holiness and intentionally care for creation as good stewards and faithful disciples.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors who are worshipping with us today and to those who are viewing online.
