Pentecost VII

Although we are experiencing a drought, there are still parishes that continue to have moderate rainfall. In these parishes there is a lot of green vegetation and lush flora which can be seen on the landscape as there is a major absence of pollution and toxic waste. The connection between our abuse of the planet earth and the environment and how it affects the cycle of rainfall and produces destructive hurricanes, has been overlooked by many of us. Until we accept this cause and effect correlation and implement sustainable strategies to arrest this cycle, we will continue to see longer periods of drought and less seasons of rainfall, according to meteorological reports. It must be accepted that our actions have consequences as what we sow, we will reap. Jesus alluded to this cause and effect relationship as he stated that it is not what goes into us that is the cause of sin. What we consume does not affect our thought process, or what we say, or our attitude and behavior. "it is not what goes into us that defiles us" (Mark 7:14-15). The root of the issue is our self-centeredness and the toxic focus of our self-interest which affects our attitude, behavior and

The effect of this Pandemic on our attitude and behavior can be seen in the wearing of a mask. It is accepted that the wearing of a mask to cover our mouths and nostrils, reduces the spread of Covid-19. This reality is rejected by those who don't wear a mask, who not only place our lives at risk, they are being flippant with their own health and the health of those around them. As Jesus stated it is not what we eat which affects our belief, attitude or behaviour rather it is the selfishness of our human nature. At the center of the refusal to wear a mask is the selfishness of individuals who would just want to do as they please. They determine what they want to do regardless of its effect on others. This toxic self-centeredness is a reflection of their heart which results in poisonous actions that will affect people's health.

At the core of our faith is the state of a person's heart. It is the heart of our soul that reveals who we truly are and our intentions towards others. As Baptized disciples of Jesus we are called to act out of our experience of God's love for us and humanity. In this way God's love transforms our hearts so that we intentionally act towards people with compassion and care for their health's sake and ours. In light of this, the wearing of a mask by all of us is necessary for the protection of our health and the health of others in this time of a Pandemic.
