As we celebrate both Emancipation and Independence Day , we honour the activism and persistent uprising of our ancestors which reduced the plantation economy to be financially nonviable and unproductive. These actions of slaves, including Nanny, Cudjoe, Tacky, Sam Sharpe, Paul Bogle and others who mounted different forms of resistance to destabilize sugar production and the system of slavery which forced the British Government to pass the Emancipation Act of 1833 (effective 1834) which was terminated in 1838. The sacrifice of the few must be the focus of our annual celebration, so that each generation will recognize and acknowledge the price paid for the liberation of our human dignity and the freedom which we enjoy.

The uprising of slaves against their subjugation indicates their resolve never to accept their condition as their freedom is a God given right and that, they are created in the image and likeness of the God who said to the oppressors of Egypt, "Let my people go, so that they may worship me ..." (Ex.9:1b). The release of Hebrew slaves from bondage was seen as a liberating action of God, who raised up Moses to provide leadership for their exodus to the promised land. The Genesis creation narrative tells us that, we are created free to worship, work and engage in raising a family and building community. It is through our collective efforts as a people and the sustaining grace of God that we seek to achieve the goal of building a country to be the place of choice to live, work, raise families and to do business.

To accomplish this goal of building a just society demands that we eliminate poverty, the social inequities and transform our educational structure and system, that continue to contribute to the unacceptable level of crime, gun violence, illiteracy, domestic violence and child abuse. This will facilitate each generation to be empowered to achieve their fullest potential and development which is necessary for us, to have a stable family life for our wellbeing and a more cohesive and just society.

Our journey from the plantation house of bondage to the estate of freedom through Emancipation, demonstrates the unflinching commitment and courage of those who fought for our freedom. The journey from Stony Gut to Independence was achieved by the self-sacrifice and actions of those who fought for our self determination and for us to be free from fear and to enjoy the liberties which we often take for granted.

May our festivities be marked with our compliance with the public health protocols which are necessary for our health and safety.

We welcome His Grace the Most Rev. Dr. Howard Gregory, Archbishop of the West Indies, who is our celebrant and preacher today and his wife Charmaine.
