“Honour the Lord by leading people to become disciples of Jesus”. A banner with these words was placed across the sanctuary of a church. It was a vivid reminder to the members of the church of their mission as they lived in the world; to lead and guide people to become disciples for the kingdom of God. This mandate for us poses many challenges, including the perception that the Christian faith has become more associated with emotional therapy: “soothes our sorrows, heals our wounds, and drives away our fears.” The presentation of the crucified Saviour, who died for us; with His blood He has saved us, to God be the glory for what He has done. This life transforming power of the gospel remains the primary proclamation of the baptised disciple of Jesus. It has a power capable of changing the lives of men and women, as they come face to face with the person and presence of Jesus Christ as Saviour, the source of the **New and Abundant Life**.

The crucified Jesus who was raised from the dead, makes a claim on people's lives despite their concerns about bread and butter issues and the effort to get through each day. The gospel challenges us to ask the question, to whom do we belong? An assessment of our lives and work without any reference to God can only produce self-centred oriented lives. A relationship shared with Jesus takes us out of self-centred focus to encounter the God who is the source of lasting life, love, joy and peace. In this relationship God's very self is our experience and inheritance. Jesus commissioned His disciples and sent them out with a message of hope and healing which demanded a change of heart through repentance. (Mark 6:12)

We are never too old or too young to carry out the mission of sharing the Good News that Jesus came to give us **New Life**; the **Abundant Life** of God. Do we believe and practice this Good News? We have the opportunity through worship to be renewed by the Holy Eucharist so that we can help people to experience the **New Life**. The **New Life** in which they are no longer shackled to the immediate satisfaction of their perceived needs, and with hearts addicted to material things. It is the Holy Spirit that transforms our hearts and grant us the gift of the **New and Abundant Life**. Let us share this good news that the fullness of God's love and life is available to all.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors who are worshipping with us today and to those who are participate online.
