**The Rector is out of Office on Mondays**

What do we know about the life of Jesus from the Gospels and historical sources such as Flavius Josephus a noted Jewish historian? He went about preaching and teaching on the Kingdom of God, healing the sick and exorcising the possessed. In this threefold action, Jesus demonstrated to the people that the mercy and love of God were being expressed for humanity and creation. For three years Jesus walked throughout Galilee, Judea and Samaria. He confronted the religious leaders and political authorities with a message (God's Kingdom), which they found unpalatable and viewed as a threat to the status quo. He met people at their point of need and communicated the transforming love of God. This transformed their lives and opened their eyes to see that they were no longer shackled to the narcissistic nature of sin. Thus, they were freed to fulfill God's purpose in their lives, which produced a sense of meaning and imbued them with the joy and peace of God. This is God's Mission for which Jesus lived and died and which flows from the heart of God, empowered by the Holy Spirit that constitutes the Church.

God invites us, unworthy as we are, yet redeemed to participate and partner in this Mission of God, as baptized disciples of Jesus, who have been sealed by the Holy Spirit through confirmation, for the purpose of witnessing to what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. "The church participates in the reconciliation that Christ has accomplished. It exists as a fellowship of reconciliation in itself and is sent into a divided and alienated world with a message of reconciliation." (A MINISTRY SHAPED BY MISSION, Rev. Dr. Paul Davis). To make forgiveness available, reconciliation a reality, peace, wholeness, fellowship and communion are at the heart of what God did for us. This has grafted us into the community of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The context and culture may change; however, the witness and work of the Christian church remains, worship, witness, mission and ministry. It is into this catholic and apostolic faith of mission and ministry that all baptized are called to be ministers.

We extend a warm welcome to the Rt. Revd. Leon Golding, Suffragan Bishop of Montego Bay and all our visitors who are worshipping with us here and online.
