We live in a world where the dominant culture states that our worth is dependent on what we accumulate and achieve. This places on us a lot of pressure as we pursue a performance based type of living. There is also a culture that defines success as possessing wealth, receiving recognition, social status and promotes the dominant views of a capitalist system. A system that rewards the survival of the fittest and its culture is grounded on the notion that, "you are as valuable as our popularity, success, status, or social recognition," as a means to live a fulfilling life. Unfortunately, many Christians embrace these values that are contrary to the sacred values of the Kingdom of God, as described in the Beatitudes of Matthew chapter five verses three to eleven (Matt. 5:3-11). According to the Gospels, Jesus admired those who lived a lifestyle of self-giving and self-sacrifice, as they work for justice and with a heart of charity for the "least of these".

These are the people who pour out their lives in humble service, and seek to promote God's agenda and purpose, which is, to advocate for the welfare of the "least of these"; the poor, the defenseless, the vulnerable, the destitute, the social outcast and lepers of society. "As you did it to one of the least of these, you have done it to me" (Matt.25: 40). The structures and systems that create and perpetuate the social conditions of the "least of these" must be our priority as the people of God. What quality health care can they access and afford, in a system that places the need for dialysis outside their reach? There is the political economy that continues to reward the few and underdeveloped the majority, made up of employees, labourers and minimum wage workers. The level of poverty in our society is an issue of social justice, as it is the socioeconomic policies over the decades that made many of us "hewers of wood and drawers of water." It is Jesus who champions the issues and conditions of the "least of these," and who has given to His disciples the mandate to do as He did. "Follow Me."

Jesus invites us to sit at His table where all are fed especially the "least of these" and nothing that we need is scarce. This is the Lord's Table, located within the household of God's economy and gives us daily bread, provides the breath we breathe, vitamin D through sunlight, rainfall to quench our thirst for water and the word of life to satisfy our soul's desire. In this economy of God's Kingdom, there is equity for all and no one is denied justice, peace reigns and all are embraced and accepted with unconditional love. These are not vain promises that cannot be achieved in half a decade, rather they are God's provision for us each day and for our health, our well-being and welfare.

We extend a warm welcome to Rev. Canon Michael Allen and to all our visitors, congregants and children who are worshipping with us today and online.
