The election of September 3, 2020 has demonstrated the capacity of our Jamaican people to respect the democratic process despite a turnout of 37% of those on the electoral roll. We congratulate the Prime Minister elect, the Leader of the Parliamentary Opposition and the members of Parliament elect as we look forward with great expectation to new initiatives that will move our economy from being dependent on tourism and remittance as the two major earners of foreign exchange. It will take our economy another four or five years to grow as it has contracted significantly due to the Pandemic, according to our economists. They have also made the forecast that there will be a reduction in employment and the job market will shrink. The road ahead remains a challenging one, as there is the unacceptable level of crime in our society, which attracts many of our disengaged youths. There is also the reckless and dangerous driving by taxi drivers and other motorists, which is a matter of law and order in our society that demands the same level of attention as growing the economy. These are some of the major challenges facing the new government and will demand our collective effort and support.

The Gospels indicate that there are different aspects to Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God as both a future and present reality. It is clear that for Jesus, the presence of the Kingdom is the reign of God's transforming action and this was evident through the life and actions of Jesus. In response to the question asked by John the Baptist through his disciples, "Are you the one who is to come or shall we look for another?" Jesus said, "Go tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news brought to them" (Luke 7: 20-22). Thus, in Jesus' reply we have signs which indicate the presence of the Kingdom, which is the initiative of God and the action of God through Jesus. Through this, we experience a personal relationship in which we embark on a lifelong transformation from sin, selfishness and a determination to have one's own way, to cooperating with the Holy Spirit to produce the fruit of the Spirit, which is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness...(Gal. 5:22-23).

The implication and impact of the Kingdom's presence is its demand for a response which is acceptance or rejection of the reign, rule and activity of God at work in the world, its culture and within ourselves. It is to this end that we work and witness as Baptized disciples of Jesus, called to pray and work that the Kingdom of God may come on earth as it is in heaven. This is our mission to evangelize by making known the saving grace and mercy of God revealed to us in Jesus Christ.

We extend a warm welcome all our visitors who are worshipping with us here and online.
