Did You Know?

All Saints' Day had its origins in the fourth century, when churches in the East began to celebrate "the *Feast of the Martyrs* of the whole world" on the Sunday after Pentecost. In the early Middle Ages, the church of Rome assigned it, the much later date of November 1, and broadened the feast to include all the saints. Western Christendom has followed this custom ever since. (Stephen Reynolds, *For All the Saints*, 2007).

Quote for Reflection

"In our era many believe you can be a Christian without the Church, and perhaps you can be a better Christian without the hypocritical complications of church life. But the saints urge us to be in the church, engaged with other Christians in prayer, worship, and service. The church has a book, a set of prayers and practices, and its saints; it is our privilege to be shaped by its treasury. The church is a place where we can stand.
