Did You Know?

The Feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in which there was a rise in secularism, and people increasingly lived their lives as if God did not exist. Pope Pius XI felt that a feast celebrating the kingship of Christ over all humanity would be especially appropriate ... [since it would enable] nations to see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state; that leaders and nations would see that they are bound to give respect to Christ, and that the faithful would gain strength and courage from the celebration of the feast... [because] Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills and bodies. (*Enchiridion of Indulgences*, 1968)

Quote for reflection

When once men [and women] recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony. (Pope Pius XI, 1925)

- In what ways do our lives reflect that Christ is in control as King?
