The Rector is out of Office on Mondays

There is one question that each of us may fittingly ask on this Trinity Sunday: Am I truly worshipping One God? I do not mean that we are likely to be worshipping several gods.

We read that it is through Christ that we have our way to the Father. This is not necessarily a true account of how you first began to believe in God; it is a description of all truly Christian faith in God. It is not difficult for us, even as Christians, to think about God in ways which are incompatible with our own understanding of Jesus. Even the thought of God as Father is only securely founded if he is for us primarily the father of Jesus, the perfect example of "like father, like son." Michael Ramsey wrote: "We need continually to Christianize our idea of God."

We read that it is "in the one Spirit" that we have our way to the Father. This means that we should never forget that the God whom we worship works within us and that we "have our way to Him" only if and when he has his way in us. This should mean that whenever we believe that the Spirit is at work we must test that belief by the conviction that he is the Spirit of Jesus. Whenever God the Holy Spirit is at work, the marks of Christ's work are to be seen.

We need also to look at the phrase, "our way to the Father". No New Testament writer speaks about us all being God's children; they write about us becoming His children. Paul could even write about our need to be adopted by the one who is our Father. That is one reason why the word "brother" in the New Testament always refers to a Christian brother. Much that we now say about all persons being "brothers and sisters" is said in the New Testament about all persons being "neighbours", and when you think of what it means to live like brothers and sisters and as children of Father-God, it becomes clear why the New Testament writers wrote as they did. The Gospel of Trinity Sunday is that we and all persons may not only believe that God is Father and learn what kind of father He is, but may also live as His children and as members of His family. We are so able because of our baptism and incorporation into Christ the Son and because our lives are constantly guided by the Holy Spirit.

We extend a warm welcome to our celebrant and preacher Rev. Fr. Louis Hurst. Special welcome to all who are worshipping with us today, and those on the virtual platform.
