Faith Formation and Christian Education**Did you know?**

The proper disposal of waste, especially the ones humans produce, is key to our care of God's creation. Unfortunately, we produce tons of waste and dispose of them in ways that harm the earth. Over 32% of us burn our garbage, and we illegally dump over 300,000 tons of waste annually. Burning adds to the warming of the planet and destroys the earth's nutrients. Dumped garbage ends up in our drains, gullies, rivers and sea; it leads to flooding and compromise our health and the wellbeing of plants and animals. Stewardship of God's creation means we (individually and collectively) must find better, more environmentally friendly ways to dispose of our waste.

Quote for reflection

"May we not waste this moment. We must decide what kind of world we want to leave to future generations. God mandates: 'Choose life, so that you and your children might live' (Dt 30:19). We must choose to live differently; we must choose life....Caring for God's creation is a spiritual commission requiring a response of commitment. This is a critical moment. Our children's future and the future of our common home depend on it." *A Joint Message for the Protection of the Creation (2021) by Archbishop Justin, Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew and Pope Francis*
