On Tuesday, November 30, 2021 we celebrated the Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle our Patron Saint. This marks the day on which the church was formally constituted as a place of worship. Andrew is described in the gospels as the first missionary disciple. As one of the two disciples of John the Baptist, who were directed to follow Jesus, Andrew received an invitation to stay with Jesus, and this he did. After the experience with Jesus, Andrew went and told his brother Simon Peter, "We have found the Messiah. (that is the Christ) John 1:35-41. Andrew's conviction was born out of his many hours of interaction with Jesus, whom he wanted to get to know, to be taught by Him and to enjoy His company. "Come and see" says Jesus. Time spent and personal contact enabled Andrew to grow in understanding and fellowship with Jesus so that he could "Follow Him".

As Andrew interacted with Jesus, he was able to identify his ministry and vocation, as he aligned his life with the divine purpose; he went and told his brother about Jesus as the Messiah. It is through our growing in the faith of Jesus, that our lives are empowered by the Holy Spirit for ministry. As persons who are baptized and affirmed through the laying on of hands in Confirmation, do we have a ministry for the advancement and action of God's kingdom? Do we practice a ministry of worship and prayer? Do we practice a ministry of tithing and sacrificial giving? Do we practice and participate in the church's ministry of witness, service and social justice for the poor and marginalized? Do we promote and nurture a spirit of miracles, of signs and wonders which Jesus lived? We are called to grow in faith and intentionally follow Jesus and pursue a ministry of prayer, worship, tithing, witnessing and serving as disciples of Jesus.

In order for any relationship to grow, the first need is for us to set aside time to be with the person and second, the giving of undivided attention to facilitate understanding, affirmation and validation. For a disciple to walk as Jesus walked and live a Jesus shaped life will demand time to be with Jesus. This requires our ability to give undivided attention of mind and heart in order to grow in friendship and companionship with the Lord. "We are born with a yearning for God that we can try to fill with material goods and accomplishments. At the end of the day, however, we are left wanting more." (Let Nothing Disturb You, St. Teresa of Avila). As we make time to be in the Lord's presence, like Andrew, we will grow in grace and faith. It is our belief and actions that will enable us to be living witnesses of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

We extend a warm welcome to all visitors, and those who are joining us online.

Last Sunday we lit the First Candle in our Advent Wreath, and celebrated the patriarchs. This First Candle reminded us of our Hope in Christ.

Today we light the Second Candle of Advent, the Candle of Love. In their old age God gave to Zechariah and Elizabeth a son called John. John spoke to the people bravely in the desert denying his own comforts and prepared to die for what he believed. John taught that we should share what we have with others, treat each other kindly and show God's love. He did this because he cared for people and wanted them to repent and find God's forgiveness.

The Candle of Love

In His teachings, Jesus said "I give you a New Commandment: **Love** one another as I have loved you, so you are to **love** one another." (St. John 13:34). He demonstrated this **love** through forgiveness and laying down His life for humanity. "Greater **love** has no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends" (St. John 15:13). Jesus taught that if there is **love** among us, then all will know we are His disciples. (St. John 13:34-35).

We light the candle of **Love** to remind us that **love** is the fulfillment of the law and through Christ we experience the **love** of God, which has been shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit which is given to us. (Romans 5:5).
