Celebrant: Today is the third Sunday of Advent and we will light the

Candle of Joy.

Last Sunday we lit the second candle in our Advent Wreath, and celebrated the patriarchs. The first candle reminded us of our Hope in Christ, the second candle reminded us that Love is the fulfillment of the law and through Christ we experience the love of God.

Today we light the third candle of Advent, the candle of **Joy**. When the angel Gabriel told Mary that a special child would be born to her she was filled with **joy**. She sang a song that began with the words: My soul magnifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour". Just as the birth of Jesus gave great **joy** to his mother, so his presence in the world gave **joy** to those who had none before. He healed them and gave them hope and love when they believed in him.

The Candle of Joy

Jesus taught his disciples to rejoice at His second coming as that meeting will bring eternal **joy**, for we will be with Him forever (John 16:22, 1 Thes. 4:17). **Joy** is a fruit of the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit that grows from within us, and this **joy** is rooted in a personal relationship with the God of love. Also the **joy** we experience in worship and prayer gives us courage to proclaim the good news of Jesus and the gospel of the Kingdom of God.

We light the candle of **Joy** to remind us that when Jesus is born in us we have **Joy** and that through him there will be everlasting **Joy** on earth.

Did you know?

The Collect for the Third Sunday of Advent is found on page 157 of our BCP. It has as its source the second oldest service book used in the western Church, known as the Gelasian sacramentary. Its original form underwent several transformations, a version of which Archbishop Cranmer included in the first Book of Common Prayer, but with slight changes, some of which have now been removed. The expressions "stir up your power" and "we are sorely hindered by our sins" in the Collect, recall Psalm 80:2 and Hebrews 12:1, respectively.
