As the Christmas celebration and season came to an end on the fifth of January, it's message of the Incarnation; "the Word became flesh and lived among us" (John 1:14) must be a constant focus in our every day walk throughout the New Year.

Today we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ, which marks the beginning of his Ministry and public life. In this act Jesus identifies with the spiritual needs of humanity and is empowered by the Holy Spirit. "The difference between John's baptism with the Holy Spirit is illustrated in the account of Paul's meeting with some disciples in Ephesus. They had been baptized by John but did not know about the Holy Spirit. Paul explained that John's baptism was for repentance and telling people about the one who was to come. Paul then laid hands upon them, and they received the Holy Spirit. Thus the Spirit is received through the message and baptism in the name of Jesus Christ." As members of Christ through baptism, the indwelling presence of the Spirit anoints us to live the Gospel and proclaim the Good News.

Baptism is not merely a ceremony, it is the action of the community of the baptized that initiates a person into the faith of the *One* who lived and died for our salvation. We are called as the *beloved* of God to **listen** to Him, **submit** to Him and to **follow** Him, day by day. This is our commitment and sacred trust as the Baptized people of God.

At the beginning of the New Year, let it be our goal as the Baptized to discern what God would accomplish in and through us. Can we seek to know and co-operate with His plan for us, knowing that all things work for good for them that love the Lord, to them that are called according to His purpose. (Romans 8:28) The question for us is, are we willing to know and do God's will? "Thy way not mine O Lord." What a challenge for us at the start of the New Year. To know God's will demands that we first seek to know the *faith*, which enabled and empowered the ONE who accomplished God's will.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors worshipping with us today, especially The Queen's Alumni and those who are worshipping virtually.

Did You Know

Epiphany is one of the oldest Christian celebrations. It commemorates the earliest manifestation of God in and through Jesus. It is even a more ancient feast day than Christmas. It was a much more bigger feast day, too. In fact, Christ's birth was originally celebrated in Epiphany. As time progressed, however, a different time was assigned for the celebration of Christ birth. In the Christian West, from which our Church tradition is more directly linked, the Epiphany centres on the visit of the three Wise Ones to the infant Jesus. Their visit is interpreted as signaling that the Jewish Messiah comes to save all humankind.
