May is Mental Health Awareness Month. Mental health is a state of well-being in which we realise our own potential, can cope with the normal stresses of life, can work productively and are able to make contributions to the communities to which we belong. Common mental health disorders include anxiety, depression and psychosis. These can range from mild to severe and can last from months to years. It is important we attend to our mental health, more so at a time when a pandemic has disrupted life and the cost of living is increasing. We should seek help if we feel sad, confused, experience extreme mood changes, have difficulties sleeping, and find ourselves withdrawing from those close to us and from activities.

Quote for reflection

“I think as I am getting older I am realising it [psychological issues] does come from time to time... I have those moments when objectively everything is fine, but you think you are, beyond description, hopeless... Read Psalm 88. I bet you will find someone in there going through genuine chronic depression. When I get like that, I may feel without hope, I may feel all kinds of things, but I also talk to God.” *Justin Welby- Archbishop of Canterbury in GQ Interview.*
