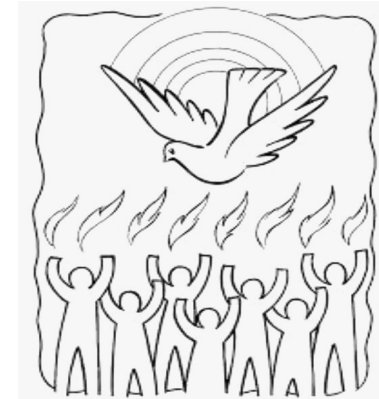

Faith Formation and Christian Education

Did you know ?

Today is the Feast of Pentecost. It is celebrated fifty days after Easter and ten days after the Ascension. Pentecost marks the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church. It is the third most important feast after Easter and Christmas. You can find the story in Acts 2:1-41. The dramatic entry of the Holy Spirit in wind and fire is reminiscent of the dedication of the tabernacle (Exodus 40) and of the temple (2 Chronicles 7). The suggestion is that the disciples of Jesus now embody the presence and glory of God.

Quote for reflection

“Through the Holy Spirit at Pentecost God in Christ became available to every believer. Christians now had first-hand experience with God in Christ. From Pentecost on, the good news was not held only by a select few who had been with Jesus, felt his hand upon their lives, and sought to follow him throughout his earthly days. Now everyone could experience the touch of the Saviour’s hand; everyone could know the healing and saving presence of Jesus Christ.” *Norman Shawchuck and Rueben P. All: And blessed be God's Kingdom now and forever. Amen. Alleluia! Alleluia!

Celebrant: Holy Spirit, who proceeds from the Father;

All: Fill the hearts of your people and stir up among us your sevenfold gifts

Celebrant: Holy Spirit, who art equal to the Father and the Son;

All: Renew, revive and empower us to be witnesses of your transforming love in the service of the Gospel.

Celebrant: Holy and Life-giving Spirit of the Father and the Son;

All: Your anointing restores wholeness to a broken world; gives healing to the sick, freedom to the captives and hope to the dying.

Celebrant: Alleluia, Praise the Spirit in Creation;

All: Boundless life of the Triune God, sanctify us. Alleluia

All: Holy Spirit of God, you come among us as tongues of flames, to enlighten, influence and to purify us, so that we may be inflamed with Your power. Enable us by the heavenly dew of your presence to worship in Spirit and truth and proclaim the mighty acts of God; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Leader: O Holy Spirit, who led Jesus into the wilderness and supported him during his forty days of temptation.

All: Under-gird us in the pressing times of life.
