

Today, being Trinity Sunday, we celebrate the fullness of God's nature and work. God is known through the revealing of Himself in action. "God is to be known only in his action, for God is the One, whose being (nature) is in his act." (Theologian, Karl Barth) The nature of the Holy Trinity is understood in terms of action, creation, community and shared love.

Many have difficulty in grasping this doctrine of the Church, yet it should not be so hard to understand this image of God as three in one. God the Father is like the SUN, for He is the SOURCE of all life. Yet the sun gives LIGHT, as God the SON, Jesus Christ, is the Light of the World. It is the sun that also gives HEAT, as does the Holy Spirit, comforting us and imbuing within us the knowledge of His purpose and providing us with His gifts for the building up of the Body, the people of God. Notwithstanding these three different aspects; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, yet we have ONE GOD as we have one sun.

God the Creator is a triune God, an eternal community of love, which flows between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This Divine community gives and receives love for all eternity. "The Eternal God is a personal God of love who has within his own triune nature, all that is necessary for him to be the eternal God who is sufficient within Himself." (C.S. Lewis) The motivation of God in the creative process is to share the Divine Life with those He has created. "God is brimful of existence that he can give existence away." (C.S. Lewis)

It is the Book of Genesis, which affirms that we are created in the image of God. This means that God created us to reflect His qualities of relatedness, sharing and mutual love, as individuals and as the community of God's people. God's creative love is "GIFT" love, not "NEED" love. It is unconditional and unmerited. God's grace did not start at Calvary, it reached out from God's decision to create the world and human life. What are life giving, life enriching and life sustaining can be seen in the very nature of the Divine Life of God, who creates, shares and vivifies life. God is made known to us by His mighty works as Creator, through His mercy as Redeemer and His love, and His sanctifying Grace.

Did you know?

The noun "mission" is a mid-16th century English word that is derived from the Latin word "missio." The word was originally used to describe one of the main themes of Pentecost – the sending of the Holy Spirit into the world. This early use of the word reminds us that mission is, at its foundation, an activity of God. That is, mission is an initiative of divine, not human, origin. Mission, then, is a work of grace that God is engaged in in the world. God's gift of the Spirit to us is an invitation to participate in God's mission.
