Did you know ?

Stewardship is rooted in scripture, recognizing we, as individuals, are not owners of our lives but rather are stewards or managers. Stewardship, quite simply, is recognizing that everything we have and everything we are is a gift from God and being grateful and generous with those gifts. The Stewardship Way of Life is the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God’s gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbour.

Quote for reflection

Stewardship is based on the premise that all that we have and all we are comes from God and as a way to thank God for all His blessings, we return a portion of the time, talent and treasure allotted to us. So, a person’s decision to give of his or her time, talent, and treasure is based on a need to give thanks. For example, in the area of treasure, a person would give the same amount of money whether their parish was \$200,000 in debt or had \$200,000 saved in the bank because they give back in gratitude to God.
