Faith Formation and Christian Education**Did you know ?**

It was an agricultural term with the basic meaning “to grow, tend, or guard in.” Later it took on several additional meanings one of which is “the collective customs and achievements of a people.” According to Richard Niebuhr, in his book, “Christ and Culture,” these collective customs and achievements speak to a group’s “language, habits, ideas, beliefs, customs, social organization, inherited artefacts, technical processes, and values.”
