Did you know

The first Wednesday, Friday and Saturday after Pentecost are called "Ember Days." So are the first of these weekdays following St Lucy's Day (13 December), Ash Wednesday, and Holy Cross Day (14 September). Thus Ember Days occur four times per year. The word ember originates from the Latin quatuor tempora ('four times'). Originally, Ember Days were linked to agriculture. They have since evolved to become times set aside to pray for both ordained and non-ordained individuals serving God in their diverse ministries. The prayers for Ember Days are in the Prayer Book on pages 200-201. The Bible readings are indicated on page 703.

Mission and Types of Evangelism

The Mission of the church is the proclamation of the gospel by every baptized disciple of Jesus. All Christians are called to be a witness to Christ where ever they be using the gifts given to them by the Holy Spirit.

Below is listed some of these forms of evangelism with a description of each one. There are many ways to evangelize because it should not just be something you do now and then but rather it is a lifestyle, an intentional lifestyle.

Relational Evangelism:

Lifestyle evangelism occurs when a person estabilish *rapport* with a person and over a period of time earns the right to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. It is much different than "cold turkey" evangelism where we go door to door unannounced and share the gospel.

Friendship Evangelism

This creates an environment of friendship and trust, which allow an unbeliever to become receptive and open to the gospel of Jesus Christ. In this case, the believer and unbeliever build a trusting relationship, and the unbeliever comes to understand and embrace the belief system of the Christian. We feel that an unbeliever is most likely to give a believer the opportunity to share his or her faith when the believer's life has first proven her/his subsequent words to be truthful and life-changing.

Servant Evangelism

This takes several forms. Some of these are:

- † Small things done with great love, such as random acts of kindness
- † Meeting the needs of others through service projects
 These actions tend to soften the hearts of persons who are not yet
 Christians, with the intent of sharing the gospel with them. They
 are done with no anticipation of being paid for this service.
