

# The Archbishop's Message for Children's Sunday, May 5, 2024

Annually the Diocese of Jamaica and The Cayman Islands celebrate Children's Sunday on the first Sunday in the month of May. Mothers' Day and Teachers' Day are also celebrated in the month of May. Both mothers and teachers are nurturers based on the roles they play in our society.

This year the Education and Youth Department's focus on "Promoting Safe Church and School For All" is timely especially since our children are at risk in so many ways. The theme "Nurturing Children For Holistic Development" is aimed at creating the awareness among adults in our society that our children need to be nurtured and allowed to enjoy safe places/spaces both at church and school.

It is of extreme importance that our children are developed holistically in order to shape their overall wellbeing. This entails providing for their physical, social, emotional, intellectual and spiritual development. It is our hope that parents and teachers will create the environment for the students to maximize their potential.

Parents should pay attention to the needs of the children and support them at every stage of development. The early years are the most important period of a child's development since it lays the foundation for future growth and wellbeing.

# Did you know that? In the 20th century,

- ◆ as part of the human development thrust, The Rev. Henry Clarke, a Rector in Westmoreland, established the Westmoreland Building Society which grew to become The Jamaica National Group; and Archdeacon Downer founded the Victoria Building Society in Kingston, both intended to provide housing;
- the structure of the Diocese was modified since the late twentieth century. One of the most significant changes in this respect was the admission of women to ordained ministry as of 1996;
- both Mandeville and Montego Bay joined Kingston as Regional Centres, with Kingston and Montego Bay being led by Suffragan Bishops.
