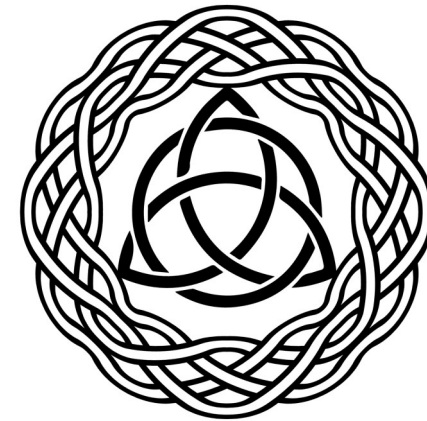

Faith Formation and Christian Education

Did you know?

The St. Andrew Parish Church was originally situated some distance from its current location. The initial building was destroyed and rebuilt in 1684, only to be destroyed again by an earthquake in 1692. The church at its present site was completed in 1700. It underwent renovation in 1879, with additions like the St. Nicholas and Blessed Virgin Mary chapels added in later years. A section of the church was destroyed by the 1907 earthquake, leading to further modifications to the structure.

Quote for reflection

“In its early beginnings, the church was keenly involved in social work, meeting the basic needs of hunger, shelter and clothing. I am aware of the work that has been done in the past at St Andrew Parish Church, (and I am reliably informed that it continues) and also the work that is going on in many more of our churches – feeding the hungry and in walking alongside those who have very little. For me, this speaks into a church that is deeply and was deeply conflicted, trying to do the right thing and respond to the needs as they saw it, but at the same time, getting it dreadfully wrong in siding with the powerful and the strong and in being heavily judgemental. We still bear the scars of that today.” ~ *Bishop Rose Hudson-Wilkin*
