**A Book Written** by Alvaro Casserly named "**Jamaica 50 yrs of Progress**" is now on sale at a cost of \$5,000.

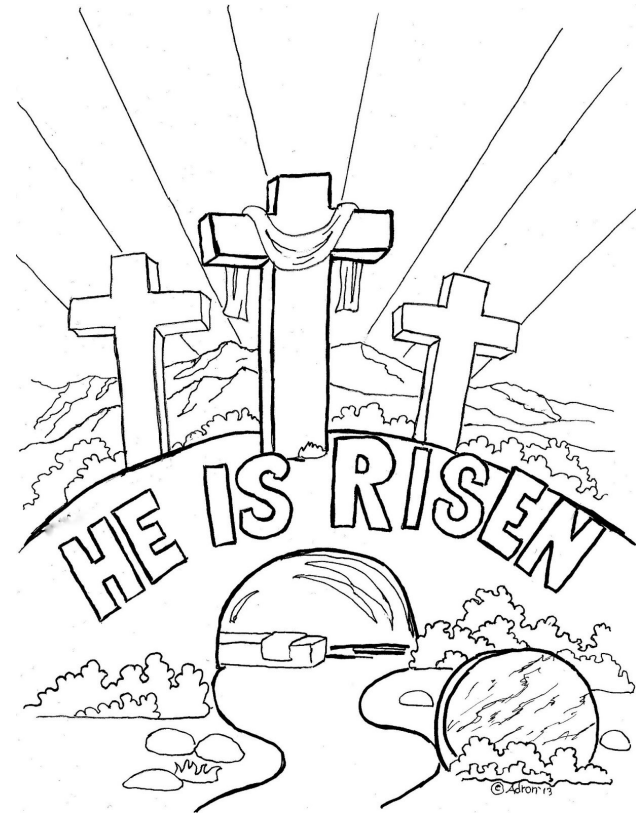

## Part 1 of The Bishop's Easter Message

### Change and Renewal

The call for change has always been part of the human cry in history, especially by the oppressed, the enslaved and the underprivileged. The early disciples initially followed Jesus in the hope that their personal ambitions would be fulfilled and the political situation in Israel would change. They may even have expected Jesus to lead a coup that would topple the imperial power of Rome, establish a new regime, and restore their sovereignty as a nation with the twelve having ministerial responsibilities.

Jesus was in the business of change, albeit, not in the way that his followers anticipated. He called for the renewal of the human heart and mind. There is a cry for change, for renewal, for us to do things differently in our congregations. We all must be willing to change if we are to keep pace and be relevant to the times. However, I sometimes wonder what is meant by the call for change and renewal, and whether we are able to identify the major difference between both concepts.

Circumstances can force us to change but we may not, along with the change, experience a personal renewal. We can go with the flow to survive with no genuine change of mind or heart. External changes, as we have seen, do not necessarily lead to a change of the human heart and mind. Renewal, for me, speaks of a regeneration, a recommitment to a purpose.

One may conclude from the gospels that though the disciples journeyed with Jesus, for the better part of three and half years, they did not appreciate his message of change. It was the experience of the risen Lord that had profound effect on their lives and changed them forever. They were renewed in Christ, and this was seen in their proclamation, their lifestyle individually and corporately as the Body of Christ.
