Did you know?

The born-again experience can be sudden and dramatic. It can involve a dramatic revelation, a life-changing epiphany, as in the case of Saul on the road to Damascus, an experience through which he became Paul. Such dramatic conversion continues to this day; some people can name a day or even an hour when it happened. There is no reason to doubt that such "sudden conversions" occur.

But for the majority of us, being born again is not a single intense experience, but a gradual and incremental process. Dying to an old identity and being born into a new identity, dying to an old way of being and living into a new way of being, is a process that continues through a lifetime. The Christian life as it matures is ever more deeply centered in the Spirit-that is, centered in the Spirit of God as known in Jesus, the Spirit of Christ.

Quote for Reflection

"In Christ we find reconciliation with the Father and with one another. That reconciliation creates a community that enables us to not harbor anger at our brothers and sisters, but rather to seek reconciliation with them in a spirit of forgiveness. Jesus offers us participation in a kingdom that is so demanding that we discover we have better things to do than concentrate on our lust, our "righteous" anger, our ways of compromising the truth. We discover better ways of being than to break promises or hide behind lies "just to get along" with one another. We need not retaliate against those who would seek to do us harm, thus perpetuating the cycle of violence. We can even show them deeds of love. We can even realize God's Kingdom and his righteousness."
