#### **Faith Formation and Christian Education**

#### **Did You Know**

Too often, we confuse God's promise of abundant life with the cultural definition of "the good life." We mistakenly think it involves ever-increasing wealth and possessions. But the Christian notion of abundance means God will provide for our needs - not satisfy our greed. No story in the Bible makes this more evident than God providing manner, the bread from heaven, to the Israelites as they journeyed through the wilderness. God generously provided for their needs, sustaining them through forty years in the desert in a surprising and unexpected way. Manna could not be stored. When the sun grew hot it melted. There was no point in hoarding it. The people had to learn to trust in God's providence and accept the gifts that God provided. "Those who gathered much had nothing over, and those who gathered little had no shortage. They gathered as much as each of them needed" (Exodus 16:18). God provides for our needs but does not satisfy our greed. Or as Paul proclaimed. "God will fully satisfy every need of yours according to his riches in glory in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:19).

#### **Ouote for Reflection**

Today, many of us think about giving only after all other claims on our resources are satisfied. We give essentially out of our leftovers - that is, if anything is left over with all the pressure to buy, spend, and overextend ourselves financially. First fruits-giving invites us to give off the top, to make giving the first claim on our resources rather than the last, and let other expenditures fall in place in light of that priority. It means offering our best to God, making giving a priority rather than an afterthought. If we give in gratitude for what God has given us, it follows that we should give in proportion to what we have received. In Deuteronomy, the people are commanded as part of the celebration of the festival of weeks to contribute a freewill offering "in proportion to the blessing that you have received from the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 16:10). And Paul commends the churches of Macedonia for giving "according to their means, and even beyond their means." (2 Corinthians 8:3). Generosity, Stewardship and Abundance - Lovett H.
