The Rector is out of Office on Mondays

Today is the first Sunday after Epiphany. On this day the church celebrates the baptism of our Lord. Today is also known as renewal Sunday, as it presents an opportunity to renew our baptismal or marriage covenant. The Collect for today is a plea for God to fill us with boldness to continually proclaim that Jesus is Lord of all.

In the first reading, a servant of the Lord is chosen to bring God's justice to the nations. The servant is charged to bring the blind and freedom to the captives. The Lord also told to the servant that the name of the Lord is stamped on it, therefore all that the Lord declared will be accomplished.

In the second reading, Peter shares with the Gentiles his understanding of the coming of Christ. He made it clear that God is not partial which is why Jesus came for all people. Jesus went forth into all regions to proclaim the good news of Salvation. All who believe this message and accept Jesus as the Holy One sent from God would receive the gift that Christ brings. In the gospel reading, Jesus goes to John to be baptized. He charges the prophet to baptize Him as a sign of humility. After he was baptized the Holy Spirit shone upon him and a voice from heaven confirmed Him as the Holy One sent from God.

Jesus journeys to Galilee, like all the others who would have come to hear and be baptized by John. When Jesus showed up and requested to be baptized, John immediately declined the request. The prophet says he was unworthy to carry out this act as he was only there to serve as the forerunner. Jesus' response acknowledged the truth of John's statement, but went on to permit him to carry out this act of God.

John acted in obedience and having baptized Jesus, the Holy Spirit came and shone on Him. The voice from heaven declared that this was the Son of God who would now show that the Kingdom of God was on earth. It showed God's approval of Jesus and the ministry He would undertake.

The baptism of Jesus was to show his humility, and that Jesus was uniting Himself with those for whom he came. Jesus consciously submitted Himself to those He came to save as an example of what the attitude should be towards God's kingdom. Through Jesus the kingdom of God would become a reality bringing the good news of forgiveness to all people.

We extend a warm welcome to all our visitors worshipping with us today, especially The Queen's School family, celebrating founder's day.

Did you know?

The Season of Epiphany begins on January 6 and continues through to the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The liturgical colour for the period between the Feast of the Epiphany and Ash Wednesday is green. This period centres on the revelation and manifestation of Jesus Christ, epitomized by the Magi's visit, symbolizing his recognition as the Saviour for all. Additionally, it emphasizes the symbolism of light, portraying Christ as the illuminating force, bringing enlightenment and hope to humanity. The season underlines the Church's mission, highlighting God's inclusive love and the call to spread the gospel universally. Moreover, it focuses on individuals' witness and testimony to Christ's significance in their lives, echoing the actions of those who acknowledged Jesus' presence. Lastly, it commemorates Jesus' Baptism, marking the beginning of his ministry and affirming his divine identity as the Son of God. These intertwined themes feature prominently in liturgical practices, encouraging contemplation on Christ's revelation and its universal implications.

“Epiphany is the day and season in the church year when we patiently watch and listen as God is quietly revealed before us once again. Sometimes, even when we try hard to do so, we just don’t see God in our everyday lives or in the events of our world. The Renewal of Baptismal Vows and Promises

Leader: In our baptism we died with Christ and were buried with Him, so that we might rise with Him to a new life within the family of His Church. We can never be baptized again, but we can, in response to a movement of God's Spirit, and after careful preparation, renew the promises made at our baptism.

As we look forward to the return of Christ as Lord and Judge, I invite you who are ready to do so to reaffirm your baptismal promises.

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as your Saviour?

Answer: I turn and accept Him.

Question: Do you put your trust in His grace and love?

Answer: I so put my trust.

Question: Do you promise to love God and obey Him as your Lord?

Answer: I promise.

Question: Do you renounce Satan, and all the spiritual forces of wickedness?

Answer: I do.

Question: Do you renounce injustice and all the evil powers of this world?

Answer: I do.

Leader: Now in allegiance to Christ, you must declare before God and His Church that you accept the Christian faith into which you were baptized, and in which you will continue to live and grow.

Question: Do you believe and trust in God the Father who made the Universe?

Answer: I believe and trust in God.

Question: Do you believe and trust in God's Son Jesus Christ in whom we have redemption?

Answer: I believe and trust in God

Question: Do you believe and trust in God's Holy Spirit who gives life to the people of God?

Answer: I believe and trust in God.

Leader: This is the faith of the Church.

People: This is our Faith. We believe and trust in One God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Alleluia, Alleluia

Leader: We shall be sprinkled with Holy Water as a sign of the renewal of our Baptismal Vows and promises.
