"The light that has come into the world is not a star but the person of Jesus. This Light, Jesus himself, still shines upon all people, revealing either a darker side of the human heart or the radiance of God's glory. From the very birth this Light arouses one to be "greatly troubled" or "overjoyed". The Light is a welcoming, peaceful warmth to which we surrender and are overjoyed. The light also thickens the darkness and makes the contrast between goodness and evil that much more magnified. Those who choose to recognize the Light are drawn to give homage and open the gifts of their heart. Those who choose darkness face a path of trouble and destruction.

Quote for Reflection

This feast of the Epiphany celebrates the Light being manifested to all who would respond. The Light also divides our world, and this division will only be resolved when Christ comes in final glory to establish God's reign once and for all. This feast invites each of us to be among the seekers of the Light who do Christ homage. Our joy is found in the real surprise of the gospel message: we are "members of the same body" (second reading) who are now the light that shines in the darkness. Our own shining fort hastens God's reign. With such grace, no wonder all we can do is set our hearts rightly, offer homage and gifts, and follow the Light wherever it leads.

The Collect of the day

Message for Meditation and Reflection

Our theme for this week is: Proclaiming the Good News to all People
In the first lesson Isaiah tell the people that their days of fear are coming to
an end. The people were troubled by the threat of an invasion from the
enemies of Assyria, who were their close associates. The prophet tells the
people that the light of God would soon shine on God's people. This would
bring great joy to a people who were once filled with sadness and fear.

In the second reading, Paul reminded the believers in Corinth of God's word
of light and truth. The people all belonged to Christ, being united with Him
through their faith. Paul wanted them to know the things which caused
divisions among them were not necessary. When the believers in Corinth
come to understand that they were brought together in Christ, they would be
enlightened to live as the renewed community of God's people.

In the gospel reading, John was arrested and Jesus withdrew to Capernaum
to begin His public ministry, proclaiming the good news of life and light.
The message He proclaimed was repentance as the gateway into God's
kingdom. Jesus also began to call together the company of disciples to
follow Him and to help proclaim the presence of the kingdom of God.

The last few gospel readings have given focus to an interplay between John
the Baptist and Jesus. First John's baptism of Jesus, then his testimony about
Jesus. Now the reading tells of John's arrest and the beginning of Jesus's
public ministry. Matthew did not indicate why John was arrested, however, it
can be assumed that it may be a result of his mission to advance the message
of the kingdom.

Following John's arrest, Jesus withdrew to Capernaum, a move which
fulfills the reading from Isaiah 9:2. For the people in this region, the light
and message of God's love would now shine on them. By this, Matthew
signals the work of God through Jesus Christ proclaiming the message of
repentance. This is an expansion of John's message who preached
repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Jesus was saying repent, for the
Kingdom (reign) of God was now taking place.

Matthew tells of Jesus calling disciples to follow Him. Two brothers Simon
and Andrew who were fishing were called to fish for people. He also called
James and John who left their father to follow Jesus.

In closing, Matthew tells that Jesus went throughout the region teaching in
the synagogues and bringing freedom to many who were oppressed. These
things he performed to show that the kingdom of was present on earth.

We are to proclaim the good news to all People.
