

Faith Formation and Christian Education

Did you know?

“Baptism after all, has been known from the earliest times as the “sacrament of faith.” The role of faith in baptism is crucial. A sacrament is a celebration in which the Church expresses her inner life as caught up in the mystery of God, saving the world in his love. It is the making visible of the Church’s hidden unity with Christ. In baptism the community celebrates its own faith, expressing its trusting obedience to the God who has made himself known to us in Jesus. Baptism is thus the sacrament, or visible expression, of the community’s faith in and reliance upon Jesus Christ. Baptism is the celebration of people turning to that faith: so it is the celebration of their faith, too. They and the Church together profess their shared faith.”

The Preparation for Sundays in Lent

President: (+) Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

All: And blessed be God's Kingdom, now and forever. Amen.

All: O thou to whom all hearts are open, cleanse the thoughts of our hearts. O thou to whom all desires are known, purify our desires. O thou to whom no secrets are hid, make known to us our inner life. Strengthen us to grow into that divine likeness which thou didst plant in us at our creation, that our feelings may rise from love and holiness, and our thoughts be governed by truth, O creator God, redeeming Lord and sanctifying Spirit. Amen.

The Confession

President: Seek the Lord while He will to be found, call upon Him while He is near. Let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the Lord, that He may have mercy on them, and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts.

President: Let us ask God for pardon and peace.
